NEW ROAD STANDARDS

Over the past several winter road seasons, DeBeers Canada has provided a significant amount of funding to increase the size and capacity of the James Bay Winter Road as they constructed the mine site for the Victor Project. This has led to a wider road capable of withstanding heavier loads to accommodate the heavy equipment required in mine construction. As well, the road was widened and straightened in many places to increase safety, and usability for all road users. Many users still likely remember that there used to be tolls collected in order to offset the cost of the road, but since January 2005 tolls have not been collected.

The Victor Project has now commenced operations, and the requirements for this stage of the mine in terms of transportation are significantly less than in previous years. This means that the road will not have to carry as many trucks or as much cargo weight as before.

As a result of this, there will also be a decrease in the amount of construction and maintenance work on the winter road. This decrease will not affect the normal users of the road, and the road will still be built to carry normal loads, a normal amount of community traffic and approximately 500 loads of mine related traffic.

DeBeers Canada is still contributing significantly to the cost of the Winter Road construction and maintenance, and is an important partner of the Kimesskanamenow Corporation in this work.
